# **Hyper Tension Convention**

BVA pilots fly between KBOS, KBDL, KPHL, KLGA, KEWR, KJFK, and KAVP as 11 controllers look on during the last Hyper Tension Convention in New York in March. The next HTC, also in New York, is July 19 at 4pm ET.

In March, 38 pilots packed the skies over New York keeping the intensity and blood pressure high for more than four hours. Signing up to fly in the Hyper Tension Convention is not required; however, we encourage pilots to pick a set of routes and departure airport to ensure the traffic is evenly spaced out across the entire event. This way, pilots depart from across the Northeast and apply equal pressure across all of our controllers.

What happened last time? The HTC was an incredible success in March because we had 23 'structured pilots' sign-up for a predetermined set of routes and they all flew their routes! On top of that, we had more than 10 drop-in pilots who hadn't signed-up to keep things interesting. The more pilots fly their routes, the better the traffic will be for everyone... and the more drop-in "bonus" pilots we'll have to top it all off!

Which controllers will be online? Just like the event in March, we're featuring the New York ARTCC this month with both ZNY and ZBW online, supported by three New York Approach controllers as well as local controllers at Kennedy, LaGuardia, Newark, Philadelphia, Wilkes-Barre, and Bradley. The next event will feature the same concept in a new locale.

# BVATC is pleased to inform you that we are now providing airport scenery updates for airports used in our events. These updates are intended to make our events smoother by matching the runways and taxiways in FSX with their real-world counterparts. In other words, the BVATC updates will result in MSFS airports that more closely match the current airport charts. For those of you that rely on the stock GPS, terminal waypoints and approach procedures are often included in the updates as well.

We have created a new page at our website dedicated to these airport updates, accessible from the navigation bar on the left of all pages (<u>click here to view</u>). On this page, you'll find the airport scenery downloads along with a forum for discussing airport scenery related topics. It would be a big help if you would report problems or discrepancies at airports that we'll be having events at in the forum included on that page. This includes both the stock airports as well as the BVATC airport updates.

Since BVATC controllers will be giving instructions based on the current airport charts, it is very important that all members install these airport updates prior to flying in a BVATC event. The scenery updates are kept pretty minimal and performance will generally not be noticeably impacted. Furthermore, automatic installers are included with all of the files, so installation normally takes less than one minute (manual installation is also available).

Our controllers fully staff two airports and provide complete ATC coverage for flights between the two; pilots are encouraged to file preferred routes and can expect multiple handoffs and busy frequencies throughout the event


# Did You Know...?

There is more in the latest version of FlightDesk than any other. With the addition of a browser pane to FlightDesk, BVA members now have access to more content than ever before. Wondering what the three-letter code for your airline is? Considering what you should put in the "Aircraft Type" box (hint: it's not "BARON")? Do you know what that equipment suffix on the end of the aircraft type means? You can find all this information (and more) in FlightDesk's browser window.

#### From East to West: July's Getaway features Seattle & Vancouver

Join us from July 3-10 along the beautiful northwestern coast of the United States and Canada for our Pacific Northwestern getaway. For the first time in our history, the event will feature "Center" controllers from both sides of the border, with Seattle Center (ZSE) covering the featured airports of Seattle and Portland (Oregon) and Vancouver Center (ZVR) covering Vancouver, Victoria, and Kelowna (British Columbia). Of course, you won't be restricted to the featured airports, and we encourage pilots to take advantage of the opportunity to explore the mountainous Pacific coastline. As usual, enroute and terminal controllers will cover all airports within their airspace (not just the featured fields).

As you know, charts for Canadian airports are not available from AirNav. However, a link to all the charts you'll need in the Vancouver Flight Information Region (an "FIR" is the Canadian equivalent of an ARTCC) can be found on the "<u>Getaway Details</u>" page of our website. While some procedures in Canada differ, chances are good you'll do just fine with the knowledge you already have so take a bold step forward into the great wide North during our getaway to the Pacific Northwest.

The getaway will not feature any special events, but look for our controllers to staff both featured and non-featured airports on both sides of the border. Preferred routes, frequencies, and downloadable flight plans are all available from the "<u>Getaway Details</u>" page of our website. Download links for the Canadian charts (don't forget, all US charts are available from <u>www.airnav.com</u>), as well as the preferred routes, are also linked below.

Please note that the server will be set to real-world Pacific Time, so we should get a little more sunlight for some of the late-night flights along the west coast as well. While this week's Regional Circuit does not feature airports in the Getaway region, we will be coming back to the pacific northwest for a reprise on Tuesday, July 14 for a cross-border Seattle & Vancouver Regional Circuit.
