European Tour Kick-Off


EGPF & EGCC Saturday, July 9, 2-5pm ET

Pilot Tip of the Month

Reporting Your Descent

ften times when flying STARs into various airports, air traffic control will give aircraft a discretionary descent. For example, you might hear a controller say "Cross the Providence VOR at 11,000" or "Descend pilot's discretion to 11,000." When this happens, it is necessary to report leaving your previously-assigned altitude, since air traffic control does not know exactly when you will begin descending. This simple, yet important courtesy call ensures that you don't end up descending into another aircraft, and sounds like "Boston Center, American 225 is beginning descent" or "Boston Center, American 225 is out of flight level 230 for 11,000."





Listen Live

BVA is extremely excited to tell you about its new service, Listen Live! With Listen Live, users now have the ability to stream live audio from the FSX session through BVA's website.
