If you have ever felt like you don't have the knowledge, skill, or currency to participate on our server, this event is for you! While it's called a Challenge, it'll be the exact opposite. In this special event for new members (located at the home airport of Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University), we're slowing things down and simplifying to give those of us who want to be part of the community but aren't quite prepared or current enough a chance to join one of our events.

This is a new member event that comes from one of the suggestions we received from members in a recent survey. It's designed to be as welcoming as possible, with additional ATC staffing and a set of training controllers who will be prepared to explain instructions and provide feedback when requested. Controllers have been instructed to talk more slowly than normal, and will be providing

all aircraft with extra spacing. We'll also have extra frequencies open, so the amount of transmissions won't be quite as intense as usual.

We'll have plenty of opportunities for you to ask questions as well as a set of experienced members on hand who can jump into the aircraft and help with anything from flying VFR closed traffic to a DME arc instrument approach.

Pilot Tip of the Month


Staying Up to Date

Whether you use the most complex add-on aircraft or you like to puddle-jump in the default Cessna 172, ensure that the navigation data—the waypoints, nav aids, and terminal procedures—you use is up to date. For example, the FAA recently decommissioned the BDL VOR, which also impacted the airspace structure in the vicinity of the airport. While you won't find the VOR on any real-world charts, FAA's 2006 data still shows the VOR in working order and you can actually track it.

Fortunately, there's a free set of updates you can find that will ensure the fixes, nav aids, and even the magnetic variation data in your copy of FSX are up-to-date. This free update even decommissions the BDL VOR so it's as non-existent in FSX as it is in real life. There is also an excellent payware source for keeping the data in your add-on FMS current.
